State Testing is Coming

Students will take the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) beginning at the end of March and throughout April. Our students have been working hard and will be able to show what they have

learned. Scott's Social Emotional Team will teach testing strategies and mindfulness activities the last few weeks in March to prepare them for the assessment.

We can work together to support your child in having a positive test experience. I ask that you support us by doing a couple of things to help prepare your child to be successful with the assessment.

- Talk with your child about the assessment.
- Make sure your child gets a good night's rest.
- Have your child eat a healthy breakfast at school or home.
- Arrive to school on time; being late creates stress in our bodies and can create a negative testing experience.
- Encourage your child to do well on the test each day. Let them know you believe in them.
- Remind them that the test is adaptive and it's ok if they feel it is difficult. Just use what they know to problem-solve their way through.
- Remind them that cell phones and smart watches cannot be on their person during testing. All cell phones must be turned off and placed in their backpack at the front of the room or in a pocket chart next to the classroom door for the assessment duration. There will be no exceptions.
- Remind them to follow all rules during testing to ensure that their classes' tests are not invalidated.
- Ask them to share some mindfulness techniques we have taught them to use during the assessment when they feel tired or overwhelmed.

Traffic and Crosswalk Safety

Please ensure you follow the drop-off and pick-up procedures in the morning and afternoon. These procedures are in place to ensure the safety of our children. It is important that everyone follows the directions of the staff at drop-off and pick-up times. Your children need to use the provided crosswalks. No student should be walking between vehicles and through busy traffic. If you choose not to drop your children off at the designated location, you must park and walk your children to the gates. Do not drop your children off in the middle of the parking lots and have them walk between cars or our buses. They are too small to be seen. Follow all speed limits and traffic laws as you drop off and pick up your students in and around the school. You are instrumental in helping keep our students safe. Thank you.

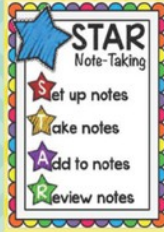
AVID Strategy of the Month

March: STAR Notetaking

What is Star Notetaking?



STAR Notes teach elementary students two-note taking formats: two column and three column notes. Each format can be adapted to any content area and requires students not only to actively read, but to also process their learning.



Why STAR Notes?

The STAR strategy helps teachers scaffold notetaking into their classroom and helps students learn how to take notes. The STAR strategy provides teachers and students a framework for taking notes, which involves both in and out of the class components to help students learn to use their notes as a study aid.

How to: STAR Notes



How to: STAR Notes

Set Up Notes:

write name, date, class and title in the center of the page, two or three columns

Take Notes:

write facts, details, explanations, definitions -use abbreviations, pictures and drawings -use dots, dashes and numbers -use colors to highlight key concepts

Add Notes:

make additions or deletions - highlight or underline important points, add any AHHA'S

Review Notes:

review notes daily or weekly - cover the notes and rewrite them from memory -summarize your notes

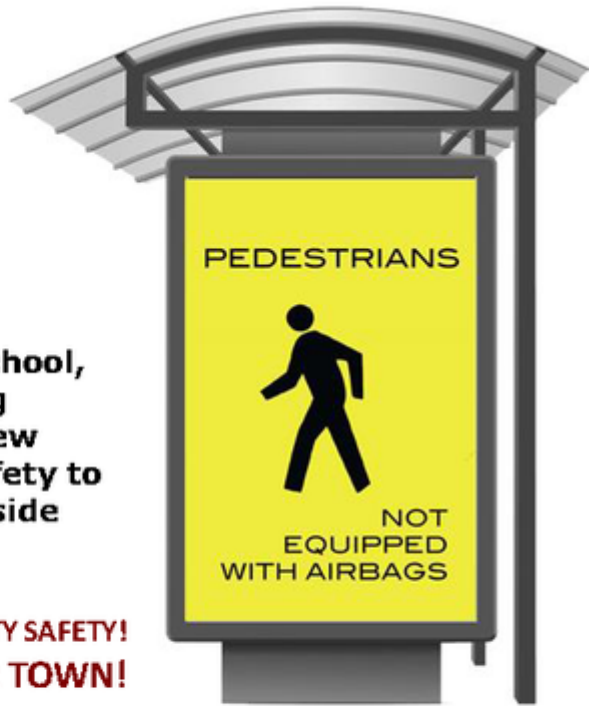

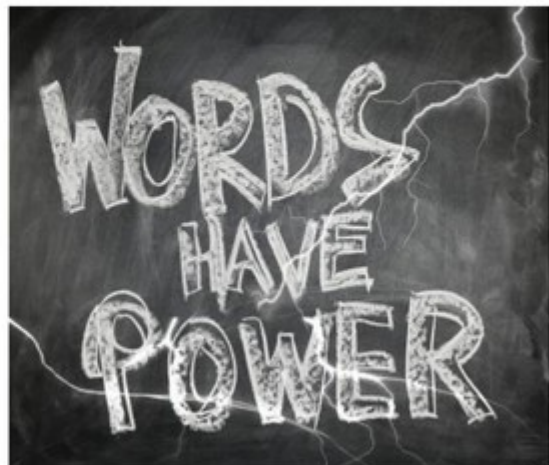


Tolerance and Respectful Language

As a school, we are teaching students the academic standards as well as societal norms that we all need to build a better community.

Scott Elementary is asking for your help!! Please discuss the usage of language and the effects of words. Any usage of racially incentive language will result in behavior consequences in accordance with CCSD policy.



Scott Book Challenge Library Program

The Scott Book Challenge is back! This program encourages students to read, read, read. Students receive a bookmark and list 10 books that have read completely and without duplicating a book title. When they turn the bookmark into the Library they will receive a prize. After the student has completed 3 bookmarks (30 books), they will complete a book recommendation before receiving another bookmark. All bookmarks are placed into the Grand Prize Drawing, which will be held at the end of the school year. 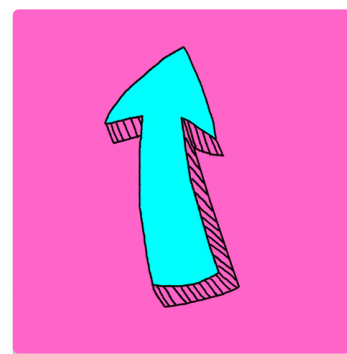
This is a free, first come-first serve event to any high school junior or senior that needs prom attire. We operate on the honor system, so no proof of financial need is necessary.
